What year did you join RKG?

MARTHA KISH - FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE RIVERSIDE KNITTING GUILD

Martha Kish decided to start the knitting guild in the fall of 1994. She put up a sign up sheet at the Knit and Stitch. The first meeting was January 18, 1995. There were 11 women at the first meeting and 3 of them were Martha's relatives that she persuaded to attend to bolster the numbers.

Martha was a woman of many interests. She was a retired special education teacher, a past president of the Audubon Society, she took golf lessons and piano lessons. She started her own tax preparation business. She planned to start a knitting business and do custom knitting for hire but realized that wouldn't work.

While she was president of RKG she organized an ARTIST'S SHOWCASE at the YWCA. She arranged to have a pianist play soft music while the knitters modeled knitwear. She invited vendors, the 2 yarn shops in town at the time and served refreshments.

Martha taught an entire Girl Scout Troop to knit with the help of Gerri Leichtenberg. The girls made squares and sewed them all together and donated it to Warm Up America, She also notified the Riverside press Enterprise and had the whole event covered in the news.

In August of 1995 Martha invited the Craft Yarn Council of America to present their program to the guild. It was a 4 day, 6 hours a day workshop that taught knitting "A to Z" It was quite intense. It was taught by Jean Lampe, a master knitter associated with The Knitting Guild of America. Several knitters became certified knitting instructors with the CYCA.

During Martha's 18 month tenure as president she had one board meeting. She wrote all the newsletters herself and printed them on recycled paper at the YWCA that would have YWCA news on the back. She organized the first guild auction that raised \$100. She served as auctioneer for many years.

Martha passed away in January 2017 at the age of 88.






Thank you ladies! We have reached our need of 40!


