RKG History - contributed by Gerri Leichtenberg* (as per August 2019 Newsletter)



GERRI LEICHTENBERG SECOND PRESIDENT OF THE RIVERSIDE KNITTING GUILD

Gerri Leichtenberg was president of RKG from July 1996 to July 1997. Meetings were held at the Riverside YWCA on the first Wednesday of each month. Gerri served as secretary and treasurer when Martha Kish was president. Dues of one dollar were collected at each meeting. Members were also asked to join The Knitting Guild of America (\$23) and the YWCA (\$20)

In the spring of 1996 Martha and Gerri went to their first knitting convention, the TKGA convention in San Diego where we first heard about Precious Pals. Later that year Gerri started Precious Pals.

When the guild first formed it was called The Inland Empire Knitting Guild. In 1996 members voted to change the name so prospective members would know we were located in Riverside.

Gerri started the RKG library. At first the books were kept in a closet at the YWCA but they began to disappear. When the library grew to 20 books or so, the guild bought a rolling suitcase to hold the books and Gerri would push and pull the books to every meeting. Gerri remained guild librarian until it was dissolved in 2018.

In 1996 the president planned the meetings and wrote a monthly newsletter. Gerri didn't have a computer yet so all newsletters were hand written, stuffed in envelopes and mailed. In 1996 the guild had about 25 members.

Gerri taught many classes for the guild: How to design and measure a sweater, Top down sweater knitting, Freeform knitting, Short rows (based on a Stitches class given by Nancy Wiseman), Dropped stitches (based on a class given by Chris Bylsma at Stitches), Steeks and 2 color cable knitting.

Gerri learned how to knit as a child of 7 or 8, taught by her Mother. Knitting has been a life long source of happiness!






Thank you ladies! We have reached our need of 40!


