After the meeting we will focus on our outreach program of emotional support chickens with a CHICK'n KICK-OFF". Information on both Knit and Crochet short rows as well as "watch out for this" tips will be covered. A special thank you goes out to *The Knitting Tree, LA* as they have donated the use of their knit and crochet patterns for this project.

Members voted last meeting to use their own stash yarn for the bodies. While the patterns suggest worsted, other weights can be used in combination to achieve worsted weight. Chickens can also be sized larger or smaller using other weights. RKG will hold a yarn swap at this meeting for anyone who wants to participate to get "creative" color combos.. More detailed information on this was emailed out from the guild on February 19th, (about 5:30pm)

Accessory packs with safety eyes, beak, comb, and wattle yarn will be provided for one chicken by the guild. Stuffing will be provided later in the year at a "stuff and truss" your own chicken session.
